| <p>About DITO's Segue Gardens:</p> <p>DITO's Segue Gardens (SGP), is a small and growing 510(c)(3) farming initiative focused on strengthening community health through equitable fresh food access, support of farms and gardens, and facilitation of discovery-based learning. It began with a social worker native to West Oak Lane tired of seeing her neighborhood decline from drugs and poverty. What started as a personal venture to clear a 20-year vacant plot used for illicit activity, quickly blossomed into a holistic plan for communal restoration. Today, DITO Inc. provides educational agriculture courses and organic produce to youth and families, from that once blighted plot. It also provides a weekly food bank coupled with wellness courses that has fed over 1000 families. Over the years DITO Inc. has built working partnerships with non-profits, universities, religious organizations, and political figures to ensure urban communities remain properly serviced</p> <p>Role</p> <p>The Urban Farm Manager oversees all aspects of DITO's Segue Gardens Community Farm and ensures successful implementation of program goals to increase availability of fresh produce to the West Oak Lane community. This role also assists with fostering educational programming to the community on how to grow their own organic food and gardening.</p> <p>The Urban Farm Manager reports to the Chief Operating Officer and provides direct supervision to a seasonal hire and several interns. This position entails managing hands-on program operations at farm as well as home/office-based program coordination and communications. This role entails assisting in community service projects with several universities and neighboring schools towards a successful growing season and farmers' market. The right person will bring enthusiasm, creativity, and cultural sensitivity to the work, while advancing community connections and partnerships. They must have great knowledge and skill in organic farming and community engagement.</p> | | | |

Essential Functions:

- Lead and manage all aspects of farm operations including orchard management, community garden, high tunnel, pollinator gardens, greenhouse propagation, with a focus on organic low-till and Integrated Pest Management growing methods
- Oversee greenhouse seedling production; determine seeding, potting up, and planting schedules for crops destined for veggie beds, high tunnel, pollinator gardens, distribution to community gardeners and community members. Oversee all seeding, watering, potting up, hardening off, monitoring for disease/pests.
- Oversee all aspects of community and education programs including community garden, community compost program, farm stand, after school garden club, volunteer workdays, workshops, community-focused donations, etc.
- Hire, train and supervise a team of staff: seasonal hire, college interns, apprentices, volunteers
- Oversee implementation of on and off-site education programs to culturally diverse groups of youth and adults with varying levels of expertise
- Serve as main point of contact for community partnerships
- Represent Segue Gardens through onsite tours, partnership meetings, conference/workshop presentations, media interviews, etc.
- Assist in developing educational materials: planting guides, lesson plans, video content, curricula, etc.
- Facilitate community connections to foster a sense of community around growing food.
- Record keeping and program evaluation: Track and analyze data related to program partners, student participants, crop plans, volunteer/intern hours, harvest records, monthly reports, and program impact and outcomes. Maintain records and provide info as requested in a timely manner.

Qualifications

- 3-5 years of experience with chemical free/organic diversified vegetable production required. Working knowledge of common diseases and pests is a must.
- 2-3 years of experience with greenhouse propagation required.
- 2-3 years of experience in community outreach required; ability to connect and communicate with people in socially and economically diverse communities.
- Experience supervising staff and recruiting/managing volunteers and interns.
- Experience coordinating and leading educational programs for adults and youth.
- Season extension/high tunnel growing experience are a plus.
- Experience with carpentry, irrigation systems, small machines are a plus.
- Competency in Spanish is a plus.
- Experience working in urban communities and Black communities and/or communities of color.
- Demonstrated interest in food justice, local food systems, farm/garden-based education and community health.
- Self-motivated, detail-oriented, with strong organizational skills, and the ability to work independently.

Application Process:

We encourage people of color, LGBTQ, religious minorities, recent immigrants, and applicants from all generational, economic, and educational backgrounds to apply.
